
NATIVE PLANTS FOR SANDY SOILS

In the Georges Pond Watershed

A buffer of native vegetation along the shoreline is one of the best ways to protect the water quality of Georges Pond as it helps slow and absorb stormwater runoff. Buffers composed of native plants not only prevent pollution, but they can also provide valuable habitat for pollinators and wildlife. The following plants are native and well-suited to the sandy soils in the Georges Pond Watershed. The best buffers are at least 10 feet deep and include 5 layers of vegetation: canopy, midstory, shrubs, ground cover, and duff/mulch.
